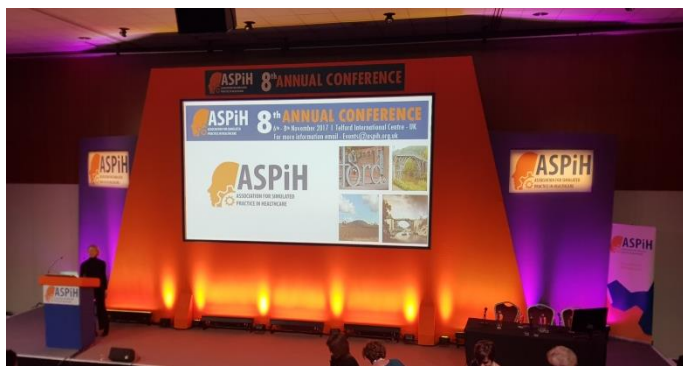
ASPIH Conference:
